Monday last Capr. Calley arrived at Murbiehead in 36 Days from FALMOUTH, by whom we are favoured with the following late Artieles of Intelligence, viz.

LONDON, March 27. TESTEXDAY at a o'Clock the Lord Mayor, attuided by Serjeant Glyra, Recorder, Adterman Buil, Mr. Sheriff Lewes, City Remembrancer, Common Seijeant, Town Clerk, eight of the Livery, and the rest of the City-Officers, went to St. James's, where the Recorder read to his Majetty the Address, Petition and Remonstrance from the City of London: To which his Maj thy was pleased to give the following answer.

" I have the fatisfaction to think that my people " don's doubt of my readintfs to attend to their coinplaints, or of my ardent defire to promote their happinels, which I cannot more effectually do, than by of relifting every attempt to faw groundless jealoufies as among them.

" Your Petition is fo void of foundation, and is be-" fides conceived in fuch diffespectful terms, that I es am convinced you do not feriously imagine it can be " complied with."

The King was attended by a numerous Court, and feemed very chearful; and before the Citizens were introduced to his Majetty, they were given to underkand, that on fuch an occasion as the present, they were not to expect to kifs the King's hand.

Yelterday the Earl of Stormont took leave of his Majetty, and . morrow will fet out on his ambally to the court of __ ance.

March 28. Letters from Paris fay, that the court of Verfailles only wait to receive some advices from the French Ambast dor at Vienna, after which that Court will declare itself an enemy to the conduct of the three united Powers.

March 29. It is expected that Parliament will not sife, at woneft, till the 20th of Ju , nor, if punishments or public censurestake place, till the month of July. The famous alliance which is now almost conclused between England, France, & Spain, is univerfally allowed to be upnatural, and will certainly there the fate of all sunatural things : it is a monfier, and cannot live long. It is reported that the city Remonstrance is to be

laid before a great Assembly. The House of Commons, it is faid, will prolong their Seffions 'till the middle of July, on account of the many affairs ftill remaining for their confideration. March 30. The present conduct of the French Amballador and Monitry, with respect to the balls, brings your recollection the expression of the Kings of Brentford : " We shall settle our state-affairsbut first we'll have a dance."

Two Couriers arrived this day from the Continent with forme spirited Remonstrances to our Court. As a freth ftroke to public credit, a very eminent

. banker hopped payment yesterday.

April 3. We hear that Sir John Dairymple has lately discovered some curious manuscripts, in the ruins of Herculaneum, by which it appears, that the old Greek and Reman patriots, were traitors to their country.

We hear that the bug-bear which the King of Pruffia holds up continually to deter our K --- from interfering with the plunders on the Continent is, the ruin of Hanover. If Great-Britain makes one offentive ftep to interrupt that Monarch's views in this scandalous affair, he threatens, as his fift throke, to pour fwarms of groops into Hanover. It appears that thefe threats. are fusicient, for it has been determined in the British cabinet, that the division of Poland can be in no degree injurious to the interest of Britain.

They write from Paris that the Court of France has openly declared, that, if any Proffin troops march into Swedish Pomerania, a numerous army shall immediately fet out for Embden, Friefland, and other states belonging to Brandenburgh.

Lat Saturday, being Foggy, the Cruiter lay at Tiber's bland point - a Brig bound to Bolton with a Load of Melalles, engaged her Attention, which the itopt, took out all her People but one, and morr'dahe Brig in the open Sound, at dead of Night, fent a Boat to the Collector's to know if the was not a good frize, but being informed to the contrary, they returned the People on Board, after having Rolen and carried away two Duffil Great Coats, two pair Duffill Trowlers, one Frock, two pair Oznabrigs Trowfers, and three Pillow Cases, which they thript off the poor Seamen's Pillows. She then came into the Chops of this Harbour, when a poor Oysterman, with an old Bost not werth 101, engaged her Attention; the Oyllerman was order'd to drike on Pain of immediate D --- with all the Frain of "d-n'd " Rafcals, Scoundrels," &c. and to come along Side the Cruifer : The poor Man (having about 30 Bushels of Oysters, and his Boat, being all he was worth) obeyed; and after detaining him fome Time they took from him five Bushels of Uyflers, and then dismits'd him. On Sunday a Two-Mall Boat from New Haven enter'd the Harbour, when these Sons of War bro't her too : She was failed by two Boys, the oldest about 16, and had on board a Barrel of Currant Wine, which a Gentleman there had fent his Friend in this Town; they demanded her Papers -the Boys knew not what they meant -But after repeated Execuatilons, in their whal Form, they tap'd the Wine, drew our about one Half, and then difmis'd the Boat. On Tuesday, one Mr. Vail, a Man about 60 Years of Age, was coming into the Harbour in a Sloop from Long Island; they ordered him to bring two and let go his Anchor, which he did, but they thinking it not foon enough, fired feveral Shot at him, after his Anchor was gone ;he was ordered on board the Cruifer, where Capt. Howe reviled him in the most abusive way, and (as he had no Oyflers or Currant Wine and did not produce any money) firuck Mr. Vail in the Face with his Fift, which fo provoked the old Man that he returned the Compliment into the Captains Muns, and placed his Honor's Head where his ffeels fhould have been; when he role, and had cleared his Joles of their own Claret, he order'd his Pistols to be brought; but on second Tho't, fet his Bruiler to beat him, but he being a Man of more Honor than his Commander, refuled, and Mr. Vail was returned to his Boat, with Liberty to proceed; the being only in Ballaft.
